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Goals:

At the end of the semester, students are able to use tools

- 2. understand the literary elements embedded in literary texts.
- 3. analyze three novels using literary elements.
- 4. critically study the social, cultural and political significance of those meanings to empower self, group and/or communities.

Contents:

This course covers concepts and theories of cultural studies and their application as the analysis tool to reveal the hidden meanings of cultural phenomena and practices as well as literary works as cultural artifacts.

Considering literary and cultural studies encompass a wide range of multi-disciplinary subjects, the available credit hours compel the course to cover only the following concepts:

- 1. The Signs: aspects of signs, signs and systems, and interactions of signs.
- 2. The Text: text and textualities, genre and intertextuality, narrative.
- 3. The Medium: the medium and mediation, myths and imagery, realism and stereotypes.
- 4. Ideology: power relations and hegemony.
- 5. Subjectivity and identity: cultural identity, identification, and the subject.

With regard to the purpose of this course, the aspects of application will become its emphasis. In other words, the concepts and theories will be learnt in the contexts of case studies so that the students are able to see directly how a concept or theory is applied. This way, it is expected that the students have the necessary practical theoretical competence in order that they can study by themselves the phenomena, practices and artifacts of culture they are interested in.

Learning Activities:

Classroom communicative expository approach with lecturing, case studies, and classroom discussions methods.
